Other restaurants on the near horizon:

- Bellini's, featuring light Italian fare at 9 South Joachim Street (the corner of Joachim and Conti Streets)
- **Noell B's**, opening in the former Loretta's at 19 South Conception, by Noell Broughton who has established a fine reputation with his Café 615.
- Bacchus, opening in mid August in the former Quatorze at 54 S. Conception Street, offering lunch daily and a full bar with a tapas menu in the evening.

Other projects:

- 250 St. Francis Street is an impressive new condominium project featuring 40 units built around a central courtyard. The three story building captures the graciousness of old Mobile, with iron balconies overlooking the streets.
- 7 North Royal is the latest renovation by the folks at Lyons, Pipes and Cook, who have successfully remodeled several downtown buildings. 7 North Royal is across the street from the LPC offices and provides storage for the firm's files on the first floor, and a lovely meeting space on the second floor.
